Sunday 7th April 2024

On Sunday at 2 o'clock in the morning we met at Brno bus station Grand – 10 students (5 boys and 5 girls) and our teacher Zdeňka Schormová. Everybody was very tired. Around quarter past two, we left the bus station by bus to the Vienna airport. Almost nobody slept on the bus, because we were very excited. Two hours later at 4.04 we arrived at the airport in Vienna.

We checked in and had breakfast in the airport hall. Then we went to the gate and a bus which took us to the **plane Ryanair** and we went on board. The plane
