

# REPORT FROM 5<sup>TH</sup> PROJECT MEETING IN LIPNIK, POLAND FRIDAY 20<sup>TH</sup> MAY AND SATURDAY 21<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2022

## Friday 20<sup>th</sup> May



Friday was our last day and we had a **tour around Lipnik**. We met in the centre of the village and while waiting for everybody to arrive we tried a local delicious ice-cream. When we all

gathered we went to the ruins and to the castle. The tour was without a guide but we could read about important events and people connected to the history of the castle. **After the tour each team got a certificate for participating in Erasmus programme in Poland.** Then we went for a walk around the dam.



At 11:00 we arrived at a **church and an old cemetery**. The Swedish team organised a **group discussion here about the concentration camp we visited the previous day.** Each national group had 10 minutes to think about the message they would like to say to everyone and to think of the ways we

could help to let the same thing to happen again. Our Czech team emphasized the importance of education and acknowledgement of everything what had happened. Everybody





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should visit these camps to see them with their own eyes and try to explain to others who might not believe. **The most important message from us was that all people are equal and we should never let one group of people rule the others. The world must never forget about holocaust.** Each team presented their own message and then we held our hands and **kept a minute of silence to honour all the people who died in these camps.**



We had a lunch in a restaurant (cauliflower soup and chicken and chips). In the afternoon we had some free time. My friends and I chilled in the teacher's garden. In the evening we went shopping to Dobczyce and bought some souvenirs and gifts for our families. We

finished the day in a local restaurant with the teacher's son and the teacher herself.

## Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> May

We had to get up very early in the morning because we had a long way home ahead of us. It was raining when we were leaving Poland. The overall experience was amazing. We met plenty of new friends and learned a lot about the area we stayed in.
